

Marin Shakespeare Company –In-Person Summer Camps 2021

COVID-19 Site-Specific Safety Protection Plan (SPP)

As of June 14, 2021

In accordance with County of Marin guidelines, Marin Shakespeare Company (MSC) is offering summer camps in the summer of 2021. Parents understand and acknowledge that MSC cannot guarantee the health or safety of all participants. This Plan outlines the processes and procedures MSC will implement to ensure the maximum safety for all participants. Students who have underlying health conditions that put them at particular risk from COVID-19 should consider not enrolling in MSC's camps. Potential Staff members with underlying health conditions should also consider not working at the camps.

Camp Protocols:

- 1. Face Coverings:** According to state guidelines:

* For **fully vaccinated** persons, face coverings are not required outdoors except when attending crowded outdoor events, such as live performances, parades, fairs, festivals, sports events, or other similar settings.
* For **unvaccinated** persons, face coverings are **required** outdoors *any time physical distancing cannot be maintained*, including when attending crowded outdoor events, such as live performances, parades, fairs, festivals, sports events, or other similar settings.
- 2. Healthy Hygiene Practices:** Students are encouraged to wash and/or sanitize hands at the beginning of each day and frequently throughout the day. Handwashing is available in the Forest Meadows restrooms. Hand sanitizer will be available at all times. Campers must bring their own water, snacks, and lunch – there will be no sharing of food or drinks.
- 3. Health Screenings for youth and staff:** All campers and staff must conduct a home health screening before coming to camp. If there are any symptoms such as fever, coughing, or shortness of breath, campers and/or staff may not attend camp until receiving a negative test for Covid-19. Any camper or staff member who experiences symptoms while at the camp will be separated from others and sent home immediately.
- 4. Identification and Tracing of Contacts:** In the event of a confirmed Covid-19 case, the designated staff person is Lesley Currier (415-499-4485 or lesley@marinshakespeare.org). Ms. Currier will be responsible for notifying exposed persons and the Marin County Health Department.

5. **Identification and Reporting of Cases:** Ms. Currier will be responsible for reporting any confirmed positive and suspected cases of Covid-19.
6. **Stable Group structures:** Each session must have a stable group of campers. Campers may not interact with campers from a different group. Each group will have no more than 16 campers and two Teaching Artists.
7. **Staff Training and Family Education:** All Staff will receive a copy of this Plan and training in how to implement it. All families will receive a copy of this Plan and instructions how to implement it.
8. **Communication Plans:** Communication will be by email, with follow-up phone calls as necessary.
9. **Transportation:** No transportation by buses or other vehicles is provided by Marin Shakespeare Company.
10. **Entrance, Egress, and Movement Within the Supervised Youth Activity Setting:** Movement of youth, staff, and parents will be managed to avoid close contact and/or mixing of stable groups.
